Author Guidelines

Preparation of extended abstracts

1. Submit your extended abstract in digital format. The extended abstract should be written in English.
2. Extended abstracts should include the following sections: Summary (in Italian and in English), Introduction, Material and Methods, Results and Discussion, and Conclusion.
3. Number the sections to a maximum of three levels (including chapter level).
4. Use font Arial 12pt., single spacing and 2,5 cm margins on all sides.
5. The maximum number of pages is 6 pages for extended abstracts that won't be published elsewhere or 2 pages for those who wish to publish the results in a scientific journal. This applies both to oral and poster communications.
6. Save your extended abstract using the presenting authors name and the preferred type of presentation (oral or poster). E.g. Smith_oral, Rossi_poster.
7. Please use the file format Word 97-2003, while assuring that the extension of your file is ".doc".

Title and authors:

1. Title: use font Arial 14pt. bold, with centred single spacing paragraph. Capital letters should be used exclusively for the first word and whenever abbreviations are used.
2. Title should be succinct and clear indicating the objectively the subject of the research study.
3. Include a 6pt. space after the title (Format Paragraph/choose the Indents and Spacing tab/in the "Before" field, enter 6 pt.)
4. Authors: use font Arial bold 11pt., with centred single spacing paragraph.
5. Affiliation (Institute, Department and City; include country whenever different from Italy) and contact author (Name Surname: e-mail): use font Arial 11pt., with centred single spacing paragraph.
6. Indicate different affiliations with number superscript.
7. Example:

Summary

The summary should be presented both in English and Italian. Each should be clear on itself and not containing more than 250 words.

Tables

1. Avoid large tables. The book size will be 21.0 x 29.7 cm. Keep in mind tables should fit this size.
2. Tables should be numbered in Arabic numbers according to their sequence in the text. The text should include reference to all tables.
4. Table captions should be included in the text at the appropriate place, before the table.
5. Create tables with MS Word table function. Avoid images, spaces, tabs or any other ways to format tables.
6. Tables should be clear without reading the text.
7. Column headings should be brief and clear.
8. Vertical lines should not be used to separate columns.
9. Any necessary explanations essential for understanding the table should be given as a footnote at the bottom of the table.

Illustrations

1. All illustrations should be black and white (coloured illustrations cannot be accepted).
2. If photographs are necessary, submit original photographs with good contrast and intensity. Sharp and glossy copies are required. Reproductions of photographs already printed cannot be accepted.
3. Illustrations should be numbered in Arabic numbers according to their sequence in the text. The text should include reference to all illustrations.
4. Each illustration should have a title, placed below the image.

Formulae

1. Formulae should be typewritten, if possible.
2. Subscripts and superscripts should be clear.
3. Give the meaning of all symbols immediately after the equation in which they are first used.
4. Equations should be numbered in Arabic numbers serially at the right-hand side in parentheses.



References

1. All publications cited in the text should be presented in an alphabetical list of references at the end of the extended abstract (no numbering).
2. In the text, refer to the author's name (without initials) and year of publication.
3. If reference is made to a publication written by more than two authors, the name of the first author should be followed by "et al.". However, in the list of references all the authors should be mentioned.
4. References cited together in the text should be arranged chronologically. The list of references should be arranged alphabetically by authors' names, and chronologically per author.
5. Use the following system for arranging your references:
 - a. *For periodicals:*

Pluske, J.R. and I.H. Williams, 1996. Split weaning increases the growth of light piglets during lactation. *Austr. J. Agr. Res.* 47, 513-523.
 - b. *For edited symposia, special issues, etc. published in a periodical:*

Noordhuizen, J.P.T.M., W.D.J. Kremer and H. Jorritsma, 2000. Quality (health) risk management through HACCP application on dairy farms. In: Blokhuis, H.J., E.D. Ekkel and B. Wechsler (editors), *Improving health and welfare in animal production*. Wageningen Pers, EAAP series 102: 65-74.
 - c. *For books:*

Engelen, G.M.A. and A.F.B. van der Poel, 1999. Post-pelleting application of liquid additives. Wageningen Pers, 96 pp.
 - d. *For multi-author books:*

Pluske, J.R. and G.Z. Dong, 1998. Factors influencing the utilisation of colostrum and milk. In: M.W.A. Verstegen, P.J. Moughan and J.W. Schrama (editors), *The Lactating Sow*. Wageningen Pers, the Netherlands, pp. 45-70.
6. Journal titles should be abbreviated.
7. Work accepted for publication, but not yet published should be referred to as "in press".
8. References concerning unpublished data and "personal communications" should not be cited in the reference list, but may be mentioned in the text.

Footnotes

1. Footnotes should be avoided. If absolutely necessary, they should be numbered in the text, indicated by superscript numbers.
